In this workshop, participants will enhance their management techniques and gain new confidence when presented with challenging students and situations. Using case study analysis, role plays, and research as well as proven protocols and routines, participants will leave with a more complete picture of effective classroom management and tools to make their vision a reality.

Participants will:

- Identify the common causes of disruptive behavior and develop an expanded repertoire of prevention techniques, intervention strategies and communication skills that have proven effectiveness with a broad range of students.
- Plan for a climate of learning that is responsive to student needs and minimizes disruptions.
- Identify how to carve out time so that teachers have the opportunity to establish relationships with their students.
- Understand how a growth mindset can improve classroom behavior.
- Implement daily routines and procedures that serve to increase efficiency, build responsibility in students and maintain order in the classroom.
- Reflect on their beliefs, philosophy and actions around student behavior within the context of major theorists and researchers.
