

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF STUDENT COUNCILS EXECUTIVE BOARD POSITIONS

Every other year* Region One must select a grade 10 student to serve on the NASC Executive board.

As provided in the NASC constitution, Article V, Sections 4c & d, the requirements for the grade 10 students are as follows: “student representation on the Executive Board shall be based upon the eight regions, each of which shall be represented by one student who will serve a two year term. Each state within the region may nominate one candidate to represent that state.” “The names of the nominee from each state shall be submitted to the Regional Selection Committee for the final choice. The RSC consists of the state executive director and state president in each state (or their designee).”

The grade 10 student selected for the NASC Executive Board must be from a current NASC member school, a current MASC school, active in his/her student council, and in tenth grade during the 2006-2007 school year. Students serve a two-year term. The student must be able to attend the NASC Executive Meeting to be held June 23-27, 2007, at the National Conference in Overland Park, Kansas. Since the term of office begins July 1, 2007, NASC cannot be responsible for travel expenses to the meeting, but will provide lodging and meals for the student until the conference begins.

The new NASC applications have not been made available at the time of the printing of this guidebook. If you have a grade ten student or middle level advisor who would like to apply, please send a letter of intent to:
